The Chairperson placed before the members the requirement of training on Outcome Based Education. The Committee also proposed to conduct a mock audit as a preparatory measure for the forthcoming NBA visit

AGENDA 6: Review of Academic Results

The Committee Reviewed the comparative result analysis report of odd semester results of 2016-17 with 2015-16 and noted the following

❖ B.Pharm 1st Sem

- In Humanities (HU 101), percentage of students scoring grade point above 7 increased from 34% in the previous year (2015-16) to 68% in the recent year (2016-17).
- 43% of students have scored above 7 grade point in Pharmaceutics (PT 106) in the year 2016-17 whereas only 31% students have scored above 7 grade point in the same subject in the year 2015-16 which shows improvement in result
- In Pharmaceutical analysis (PT 101), only 34% students have got above 6 grade point in the year 2015-16 which improved to 66% students getting above 6 grade point in the year 2016-17



- 38% of students have scored above 7 grade point in Inorganic chemistry (PT 103) in the year 2016-17 whereas only 24% students have scored above 7 grade point in the same subject in the year 2015-16 which shows improvement in result
- Significant improvement is noted in the result of optional subjects as percentage of students scoring grade point above 6 increased from 38% to 56%.
- An overall improvement is observed in result of all practical subjects in the year 2016-17 as more than 90% students have scored above 7 grade point in all the practical subjects whereas 75-80% students have scored 7 grade point and above in the previous year (2015-16)

❖ B.Pharm3rdSem

- In Organic chemistry (PT 301), percentage of students scoring grade point above 6 increased from 46% in the previous year (2015-16) to 57% in the recent year (2016-17).
- 41% of students have scored above 7 grade point in Organic chemistry (PT 304) in the year 2016-17 whereas only 30% students have scored above 7 grade point in the same subject in the year 2015-16 which shows improvement in result
- In Pharmaceutical engineering (PT 307), only 50% students have got above 6 grade point in the year 2015-16 which improved to 77% students getting above 6 grade point in the year 2016-17
- 67% of students have scored above 8 grade point in computer application (CS 303) in the year 2016-17 whereas only 5% students have scored above 8 grade point in the same subject in the year 2015-16 which shows improvement in result
- Significant improvement is noted in the result of Physical Pharmacy (PT 306) as percentage of students scoring grade point above 6 increased from 42% to 78%.
- An overall improvement is observed in result of all practical subjects in the year 2016-17 as more than 85% students have scored above 7 grade point in all the practical subjects whereas 75-80% students have scored 7 grade point and above in the previous year (2015-16)

❖ B.Pharm5thSem



- In Biochemistry (PT 504), percentage of students scoring grade point above 6 increased from 71% in the previous year (2015-16) to 80% in the recent year (2016-17).
- 57% of students have scored above 7 grade point in Medicinal chemistry (PT 503) in the year 2016-17 whereas only 37% students have scored above 7 grade point in the same subject in the year 2015-16 which shows improvement in result
- In Pharmacology (PT 508), only 66% students have got above 6 grade point in the year 2015-16 which improved to 77% students getting above 6 grade point in the year 2016-17
- 19% of students have scored above 8 grade point in Pharm engineering (PT 507) in the year 2016-17 whereas only 10% students have scored above 8 grade point in the same subject in the year 2015-16 which shows improvement in result
- Significant improvement is noted in the result of microbiology (PT 509) as percentage of students scoring grade point above 6 increased from 66% to 84%.
- An overall improvement is observed in result of all practical subjects in the year 2016-17 as more than 80% students have scored above 7 grade point in all the practical subjects whereas 60% students have scored 7 grade point and above in the previous year (2015-16)

❖ **B.Pharm 7th Sem**

- In Pharmacology (PT 708), percentage of students scoring grade point above 6 increased from 64% in the previous year (2015-16) to 75% in the recent year (2016-17).
- 37% of students have scored above 7 grade point in Pharm technology (PT 706) in the year 2016-17 whereas only 6% students have scored above 7 grade point in the same subject in the year 2015-16 which shows improvement in result
- In Medicinal chemistry (PT 703), only 60% students have got above 6 grade point in the year 2015-16 which improved to 78% students getting above 6 grade point in the year 2016-17
- 39% of students have scored above 8 grade point in Pharmacognosy (PT 702) in the year 2016-17 whereas only 17% students have scored above 8 grade point in the same subject in the year 2015-16 which shows improvement in result
- Significant improvement is noted in the result of optional subjects as percentage of students scoring grade point above 6 increased from 87% to 96%.



- An overall improvement is observed in result of all practical subjects in the year 2016-17 as more than 90% students have scored above 7 grade point in all the practical subjects whereas 80% students have scored 7 grade point and above in the previous year (2015-16)
