AGENDA 3: Result analysis of even semester

Coordinator-IQAC, presented the analysis of the even semester 2017 result-

❖ B.Pharm 2ndSem

- 72% of students have scored above 6 grade point in organic chemistry (PT 213) incorporated in new syllabus from the current year 2017-18 whereas only 67% students had scored above 7 grade point in the similar subject present in the old syllabus in the year 2016-17 which shows improvement in result
- 34% of students have scored above 8 grade point in environmental sciences (HU 282) incorporated in new syllabus from the current year 2017-18 whereas only 19% students had scored above 8 grade point in the similar subject present in the old syllabus in the year 2016-17 which shows improvement in result
- 49% of students have scored above 6 grade point in physiology (PT 215) incorporated in new syllabus from the current year 2017-18 whereas 47% students had scored above 7 grade point in the similar subject present in the old syllabus in the year 2016-17 which shows improvement in result
- 65% of students have scored above 6 grade point in Biochemistry (PT 214), a new subject incorporated in the current syllabus.
- 69% of students have scored above 6 grade point in Pathophysiology (PT 216), a new subject incorporated in the current syllabus.
- An overall improvement is observed in result of all practical subjects in the year 2016-17 as more than 80% students have scored above 7 grade point in all the practical subjects.



❖ B.Pharm 4th Sem

- 90% of students have scored above 6 grade point in Pharmacognosy (PT 412) incorporated in new syllabus from the current year 2017-18 whereas 86% students had scored above 7 grade point in the similar subject present in the old syllabus in the year 2016-17 which shows improvement in result
- 33% of students have scored above 8 grade point in Physical pharmaceutics (PT 416) incorporated in new syllabus from the current year 2017-18 whereas only 20% students had scored above 8 grade point in the similar subject present in the old syllabus in the year 2016-17 which shows improvement in result
- 68% of students have scored above 6 grade point in Organic chemistry (PT 414), a new subject incorporated in the current syllabus.
- 83% of students have scored above 6 grade point in Industrial pharmacy (PT 413), a new subject incorporated in the current syllabus.
- An overall improvement is observed in result of all practical subjects in the year 2016-17 as more than 85% students have scored above 7 grade point in all the practical subjects.

❖ B.Pharm 6th Sem

- ❖ 66% of students have scored above 7 grade point in Pharm Tech II (PT 606) in the year 2017-18 whereas only 63% students have scored above 7 grade point in the same subject in the year 2016-17 which shows improvement in result.
- ❖ In Pharm Biotech (PT 609), only 62% students have got above 6 grade point in the year 2016-17 which improved to 92% students getting above 6 grade point in the year 2017-18.
- ❖ 84% of students have scored above 6 grade point in Biopharmaceutics (PT 611) in the year 2017-18 whereas only 76% students have scored above 6 grade point in the same subject in the year 2016-17 which shows improvement in result
- ❖ Significant improvement is noted in the result of Pharmacology (PT 608) as students getting above 6 grade point improved from 90% to 92% in the year 2017-18.



- ❖ Significant improvement is noted in the result of Medicinal chemistry (PT 603) as students getting above 7 grade point improved from 48% to 59% in the year 2017-18.
- ❖ An overall improvement is observed in result of all practical subjects in the year 2016-17 as more than 90% students have scored above 7 grade point in all the practical subjects.

- ❖ **B.Pharm 8thSem**
- ❖ 84% of students have scored above 6 grade point in Hospital and clinical pharmacy (PT 818) in the year 2017-18 whereas only 80% students have scored above 7 grade point in the same subject in the year 2016-17 which shows improvement in result
- ❖ In Industrial management (PT 812), only 75% students have got above 6 grade point in the year 2016-17 which improved to 88% students getting above 6 grade point in the year 2017-18.
- ❖ 85% of students have scored above 6 grade point in Pharm analysis (PT 801) in the year 2017-18 whereas only 82% students have scored above 6 grade point in the same subject in the year 2016-17 which shows improvement in result
- ❖ Significant improvement is noted in the result of Pharm jurisprudence (PT 813) as students getting above 8 grade point improved from 29% to 31% in the year 2017-18.
- ❖ An overall improvement is observed in result of all practical subjects in the year 2016-17 as more than 95% students have scored above 7 grade point in all practical subjects.

AGENDA 4: Discussion on NIRF submission

The Committee has gone through the document to be submitted for NIRF 2018 as per the recommendations of NIRF Committee. Discussed about the procedure for computing of scores

and rankings and also discussed about additional insights such as teaching, learning and



resources, research and professional practices and rank order correlation across parameters.
