The matter is discussed in Academic Council and as per the instructions all the teachers have been instructed to take action with immediate effect.

Agenda 3: Organization of Faculty Development Programme (FDP)

Based on the past experience, a thorough discussion has been made regarding theconduct of Faculty Development Programme (FDP). As suggested by the Chairman-IQAC, at least 3-5external experts having vast experience on the subject be invited. Thefaculty coordinators are to be requested to forward the name of experts and theirspecific specialization. The IQA Cell will coordinate the FDP Programme and decide / finalize the list of experts to be invited for the purpose. Arising out of discussion, it is resolved to focus on the following aspects whileconducting the FDP - 2015.

- i. Pedagogy Learning (Course Outcome aspect)
- Cutting edge Technology
- iii. Domain Knowledge

Resolution :It is resolved that with a view to upgrade the recent developments in the field and to increase the exposure of faculty, Eminent Lecture Series will be organised once a year by inviting external experts.

Agenda 4: Improvement of research activities

The members of discussed various issues with a view to improve the quality of research output in the university.

The Committee member proposed that the Institute should consider additional information and evidence in the area of Research and Consultancy focusing in particular on:

- the research agenda of the Institute;
- research conducted by individual faculty members and their publications identifying them under various categories such as peer reviewed journal articles, etc.;
- research grants received from internal and external agencies;
- functioning of incubation center for research and manufacturing
- Involvement of students in research activities and publications by students

Resolution: One important suggestion that came to light was to establish incubation centre for research and manufacturing within the institute to encourage the research activities further.

Agenda 5: To suggest upon extension-cum-social interface activities

Resolution: The IQAC members discussed the issue at length. The members suggested that extension-cum-social activities of an educational institute can be observed under

- A.) Academic, and
- B.) Community & Commercial
- A.) Academic may include activities such as:
 - a) Policy research having social implications.
 - b) Extension activities; lecturer/workshop/seminar/conference/related to social issues.
- B.) Community & Commercial may include:
 - 1. Extension services to the society for specific needs like community hygiene.
 - Establishing liaison between society & educational institutions and their resources & assets, both material and expertise so as to increase frequent exchange of knowledge and capacities for mutual supplementation and enrichment.
 - Making all educational programmes& activities progressively relevant and meaningful to society through collaboration with intellectual and social resources.
 - Ours being a Science & Technology institute, one can think of other issues, such as imparting knowledge with regard to
 - a) Preserving the seasonal vegetables & fruits etc.
 - b) Water purification and plantation.
 - c) Medicinal plants along with how to save oneself from certain diseases-improves health.

Agenda 6: Accreditation and Related Matters

Resolution: The IQAC members discussed the issue at length. The members suggested that

- a) That the Chairman, IQAC, in consultation with the Coordinator, should develop a plan and arrange briefings in the next few weeks before the end of December to brief their faculty and staff on NAAC related matters for the forthcoming NAAC visit.
- b) That the Chairman, IQAC, in consultation with the Coordinator, should plan a mock inspection for the purpose of self-evaluation on the basis of the assessment criteria given by NAAC and that the services of external experts might be useful for conducting the mock inspection.

 That the Institute's Offices and the Departments should focus on documentation and keep a record of all the academic and non-academic activities of the institute for the purpose of accreditations and other visits by regulatory bodies;

The chair of the meeting expressed his gratitude to all the members for their active participation and suggestions, and instructed the co-ordinator of the IQAC to initiate steps to implement the decisions of the meeting.
